Although few in numbers the CMSA's European mounted shooters are extremely high in enthusiasm and passion for our sport, thanks to the help from America's CMSA members like the Townsends and Debbie and Alan Eggleston (far right). Here are the competitors at the El Dorado Shootout, held in Templin, Germany this past June.

UPCOMING SHOOTS IN EUROPE

AUGUST:

Three shoots in Sweden including the Swedish National Championship August 15, 16 at High Chapparel, Sweden.

AUGUST-SEPTEMBER:

German National Championship, El Dorado Western Town, Templin, Germany. Dates not determined yet, for information contact Keith Lanegan at: info@cowboyadventures.de CMSA history was made in Europe when the Cowboy Adventures Mounted Shooting Club held their second CMSA shoot in Germany at the El Dorado Western Town in Templin, northwest of Berlin. The shoot resulted in the first Class 2 "move-ups" in Germany and their first full class of Men's 2 were achieved. A brief look at 2008 will help us see how this was accomplished in 2009.

In July, 2008 the First Swedish National Championships took place with the help of Larry Townsend and his family. The match included some northern German shooters such as Roger and Nicola Rahn. In central Germany and near the Berlin area, Keith Lanegan of Cowboy Adventures (http://www.cowboyadventures.de) was giving mounted shooting demonstrations with his paint horse Rocky's Tru Image, which he imported to Germany from the Double E Ranch in Gila, New Mexico. Additionally in November of 2008, some Germans and Swedes participated at the CMSA World Championship in Amarillo. These competitors were Roger and Nicola Rahn, Bianca Rickmann, Heino Hagge, Patrik Ekstrand and Jessica Blixt. While 2008 was the year that Cowboy Mounted Shooting began, 2009 is the year that Cowboy Mounted Shooting!

Starting with "High Noon" at Roger's Area, the HO of the Westernriders Roger's Area (http://www.rogersarea.de) was the scene for the first International DWPQ Shootout in Germany on May 9, 10, 2009. The shooters came from Germany, Sweden and the U.S. Roger and Nicola Rahn were gracious hosts to the Wrangler and Class 1 shooters, the only Class 2 shooter being Keith Lanegan (US) living near Berlin. Sweden's Patrik Ekstrand's horse came up lame during the warm-up so Keith Lanegan let him use his horse Rocky. Since there are a limited number of pistols and shooting horses in Europe everyone shares, with Andrea Lensch (Germany) lending a horse to Jorgen Tullson (Sweden). Many spectators were thrilled by the excellent riding and shooting with Overall and Champion Cowboy title earned by Roger Rahn on his horse Rehecca

On June 27, 28, 2009 we moved to El Dorado, Templin, Germany for a shootout. Saturday morning started with a mounted shooting clinic, sponsored by Sonja Lange and Keith Lanegan, from Cowboy Adventures Mounted Shooting Club (http://www.cowboyadventures. de). who hosted the two-day shoot. Clinician Alan Eggleston, SM4, from the Double E Ranch in Gila, New Mexico helped all participants prepare for the event by offering techniques and tips to improve both shooting and horsemanship. There were a number of folks who worked together to make this event possible, like Tommy Schwenn, grounds manager and stunt show coordinator for El Dorado Western Town (http:// www.eldorado-templin.de), built a 130x260-foot arena from scratch and lent his personal stunt horse, Rico, for the clinic and shoot. Guenter Mainkin from the beautiful MO Ranch near Falkenthal (http:// www.westernreiten.tv) was very kind to lend several of his horses, trailer and other essential equipment for the clinic and shoot. Once again, pistols and horses were shared among the shooters and special thanks goes to Tommy Bloss (Germany), Bianca Rickmann (Germany), Patrik Ekstrand (Sweden), Jessica Blixt (Sweden) and Heino Hagge (Germany). Over the two days the weather was good, the spectators were plentiful and the shooting was exciting, with the competition decided by just tenths of a second.

At the awards the excitement was high because for the first time there was a full Mens Class 2 in Europe with just one more Lady needed for a full Ladies Class 2. There are now five Class 2 shooters: Jessica Blixt (Sweden), Nicola Rahn (Germany), Patrik Ekstrand (Sweden), Roger Rahn (Germany), and Keith Lanegan (US). As of this writing, there is another shoot scheduled for July 18 at Westernreiten Roger's Area, Boklund, Germany.

We like to mention the horses because it's important to note there are so few competing shooting horses in Europe with Appaloosa, Quarter Horse, Paint, Paint/Fjord cross and Norwegian Fjord represented. The "Sweet Heart Horse"award goes to "Oskar, the Buckskin Norwegian Fjord, a horse with a heart of gold in putting up with all those crazy shooters. A "thank you" also goes out to Larry Townsend, his family and the Townsend Ranch for their help and support to Cowboy Mounted Shooting in Sweden and to the Swedish shooters.

Double E Ranch sponsored the buckles for Overall Winners of this shoot as a way of thanking all participants for their warm hospitality. Also, Double E Ranch is awarding the Ladies High
